Are you curious to know the truth about your origin, and your relation to God and the universe, as it is written in the language in which Moses wrote Genesis, or are you already, as Einstein put it, a 'snuffed out candle' that would rather ignore the Truth and believe the most absurd and extravagant account of the creation and divinity as Maimonaides well describes the vulgar version of Genesis commonly known to most people?
